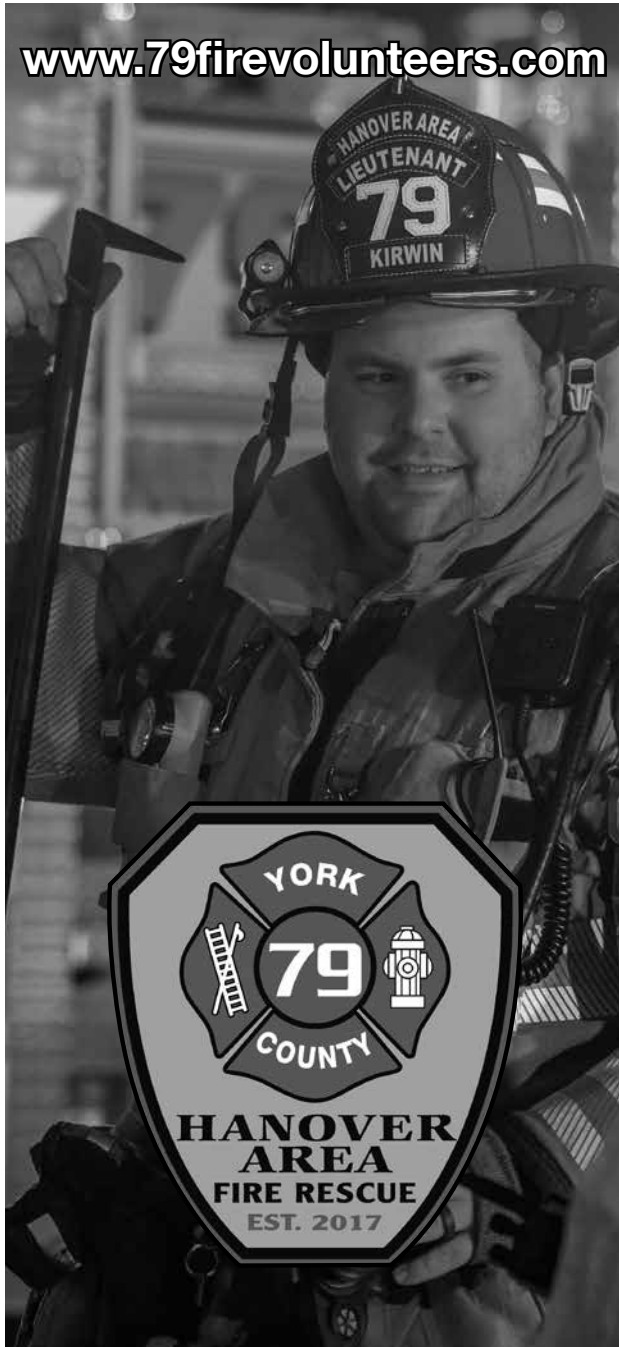

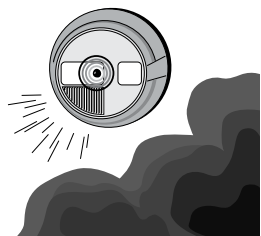

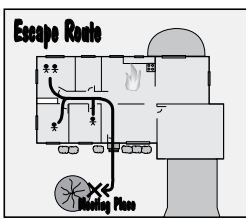
WORKING SMOKE DETECTORS SAVE LIVES



Install a smoke detector on each level of your home or apartment. Especially outside the bedrooms and at the top of the stairs. Smoke is responsible for 3 out of 4 deaths. Keep smoke detectors dust free and change the batteries twice a year. **Test all smoke detectors once a month.**

ESCAPE PLANNING

Establish a fire escape plan. Every room should have 2 means of escape. Make sure all windows open and are not painted shut. An exit route out of the house without opening a bedroom door is important. Decide on a meeting place outside away from the house. If you suspect fire, get out and call the fire department from your neighbors. **NEVER RE-ENTER!**
